Remembering Mother

Mrs. Losie Mae Spivey was the fifth child of eleven children born to Tenola and Virginia Sandles.

She was reared in Falby, Texas in a God-fearing home where she accepted Jesus Christ as her personal Lord and Savior at an early age.

Later in life, Losie and her family moved to Huntsville, Texas. After finishing high school, she met and married her husband, Herman Spivey Sr. Mrs. Spivey was the mother of six children: two girls and four boys: Norma Sterling, George Spivey, Herman Spivey Jr., Joselyn Randall, John E. Spivey and Theodore Carter (Lyn).

Mother was a very humble, gracious, loving and kind person. She was very supportive of her family members when sickness occured at a young age in her life. She cared for her brothers and sisters; always being the kind of person who opened her heart and home to anyone in need.

Mrs. Spivey's family moved to Houston, Texas where she became a member of Fourth Missionary Baptist Church, where she served under the leadership of Reverend E. Stanley Branch. She sang in the adult choir. She was always diligent about being in the house of prayer. After visiting services at St. Agnes Baptist Church, she was so blessed by the teaching and preaching of Pastor Gene Moore, she moved her membership to this ministry, where she remained a faithful member for almost forty (40) years until her health began fading. She would still speak the word of her favorite scripture - Isaiah 53:5 "And with his stripes we are healed."

Mother was an employee at Methodist Hospital, where she worked in building services for almost 30 years. Her excellent spirit promoted her to a supervising position in a matter of years. Favour came to Mother almost immediately. Dr. DeBakey, the heart surgeon, noticed Mother's diligence with her work and requested her to be the person who kept his office in order. She retired from Methodist Hospital after many years of faithful and diligent service.

After retiring, Mother cared fro her precious mother, Virginia Sandles until she was 95 years old, when she departed to be with the Lord. Mrs. Spivey has one remaining sister, Mrs. Efie Sandles who the Lord has blessed with 97 years. After battling sickness for months, Mother went home to be with the Lord on February 1, 2022. I reminisce the last time I saw Mother at Houston Hospice. I kissed her and told her how much I love her, but my last words to her was that Jesus loved her even more and if I don't see her again on this side, I will see her when I get to Heaven. I praise the Lord for my mother's life. Halleluja!!!
