At an early age, Joel displayed happiness and intelligence accompanied with an unusual wisdom that brought joy and comfort to everyone around him.

Joel Sean attended The Houston Independent School District, first at Poe Elementary, then subsequently graduating from Lamar High School. Although Joel is accepted at The University of Texas, he elected to attend his mother's Alma Mater where he majored in Art.
