Her Loving Journey



Rosie Mae Solomon was born on July 15, 1927 in Houston, Texas to Rozelia Faultry and Johnnie Solomon. She was the eldest of four girls, which meant being big sister and helper to her parents, Mamma and Poppa Vivven Collier. Her parents ran a small farm, deeded by her maternal grandfather Richard, a railroad worker located in Arcola Texas. Rosie tried but picking cotton was not in her future, instead as a young Spelling Bee Champion her teachers encouraged her to pursue her education. Rosie, affectionately known as Rose to family and friends, grew into a conscientious young woman receiving an education at Yates High School, while living with her father in Houston. Leaving school early, she put her educational goal to complete college on hold and started her career as a silk presser in the dry cleaning business.

In Houston, she met Lorenzo Fortson, a WWII veteran. They married and lovingly parented Mildred, Brenda, Jeanette (from prior marriage relationships), and Vanessa (born from their union). The latter three daughters became Texas Southern University alumnus as did Rosie, who began at a courageous age of 40, obtaining degrees in Early Childhood Education and Black History Studies. She worked in Crosby ISD, and at Eighth Avenue (HISD) schools, while traveling weekends to study and obtain a Masters in Education from Prairie View University.



Rosie and Lorenzo attended Mt. Vernon Methodist Church in 5th Ward. She enjoyed fishing and hunting in San Luis Pass, and Centerville, TX respectively with her sisters, cousins, and neighbors. In her early years, she was an avid crocheter, quilter, seamstress, and an excellent cook of fricasseed chicken, seafood gumbo, pies, and cakes. After Lo's death, she joined her neighbors at Mount Moriah Baptist Church to study and extend her Christian fellowship.

Rosie married Thurman at the age of 75 years, and began a new chapter at Berean Missionary Baptist Church under the leadership of Pastor Washington. Welcomed by a loving family congregation who guided her to a world of life's pleasure through cruises, church outings and participation in plays. She worked diligently as a mission teacher, deaconess, Sunday school teacher, senior mission choir, and was very active in BTU. She would be blessed with two God daughters, Sue English (Larry) and Dorothy Phoenix, affectionately calling her Momma Gathan.

Rosie leaves to cherish her memory, daughters Vanessa Fortson Otway (Gene), Brenda Fortson Houston (Bobby), grandsons Gibran and Khalil Fortson Otway, granddaughters Veronica Wren (Ernest), Allison Williams (Cedric), Raina Bajuk, bonus son Michael Gathan, and a host of great-grandchildren, nieces, nephews, cousins, and friends. She is preceded in death by her parents, Husbands: Lorenzo Fortson, Thurman Gathan; Sisters: Katherine Rattler, Vivian Latson, and Vennie Fields.
