Sheree Denise Harris-Fisher was the only child born to Margwyn Samuel Harris and Harriet Bernice Robbins in Houston, Texas on May 26, 1956. She was educated at JR Reynolds Elementary School and graduated from Galena Park High School in 1974. She also attended Prairie View A&M University, where she was part of the band dance team known as the Black Foxes.

A cowgirl at heart, Sheree joined the Outlaws Trail Riders group in 1981. She was elected as Outlaw secretary in 1982 and served in the position for three years.

Sheree and her parents attended Blueridge United Methodist Church where she was baptized. Sheree later was received into the Catholic Church prior to her marriage to her former husband Everett Neal Fisher Sr. in November 1989 at Holy Family Catholic Church in Lawtell, Louisiana. To their union, their only child, Everett Neal Fisher Jr. was born.

Sheree began her professional career working for the Harris County Sheriff's Office Precinct 7 before later entering the oil and gas field to work at Amoco Corporation. After leaving Amoco, Sheree took an interest in real estate and worked in that field for several years.
