

## ALEXANDER RIGGINS

He worked in the church as an usher, sang in the choir, marched in the drill team and participated in many other church functions. Isaiah was well-loved and will be dearly missed in more ways than we can explain. We cherished and loved him, but God loved him more, and decided that it was time for him to rest from suffering and his labors. Isaiah is survived by his mother, Janice Monmouth and his father, Al Riggins.
