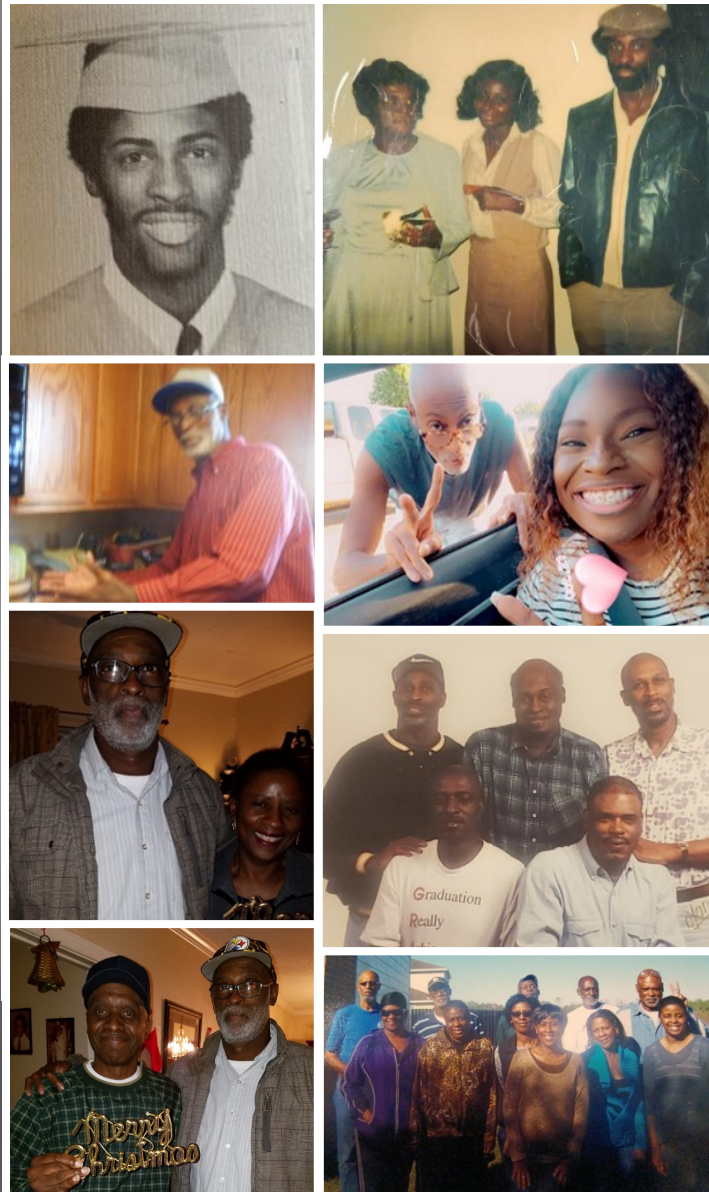
LIFE'S JOURNEY
